The wave of developments in generative artificial intelligence is challenging some of the core concepts in History and Cultural Studies: since the advent of generative AI, 'truth' as a benchmark for knowledge production can no longer be taken for granted, and guestions arise about whether 'creativity' as a source of human culture can now be ascribed to machines. At the same time, the technology opens-up a wide range of new methods and possibilities – from text and image recognition and classification to forms of academic writing. Application and reflection go hand in hand, sharpening our understanding of generative AI. The combination of active use, experimentation and critique forms the starting point for this event organised by the Faculty of History and Cultural Studies at Johannes Gutenberg University.

The international workshop seeks to foster exchange across the fields and perspectives mentioned above. The discussions will focus both on the cultural, societal and technical frameworks of knowledge production as well as questions of authenticity and creativity in machine-generated outcomes.
